Substitute Senate Bill No. 112

The Committee on Government Administration and Elections reported through SEN. CASSANO, S. of the 4th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT DESIGNATING A WEEK IN OCTOBER AS MALE BREAST CANCER AWARENESS WEEK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 10-29a of the general statutes is
2 amended by adding subdivision (69) as follows (*Effective from passage*):

3 (NEW) (69) The Governor shall proclaim the third week in October
4 of each year to be Male Breast Cancer Awareness Week to heighten
5 public awareness of the associated presentation and available
6 treatments for male breast cancer. Suitable exercises shall be held in
7 the State Capitol and elsewhere as the Governor designates for the
8 observance of the week.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill establishes the third week in October as Male Breast Cancer Awareness Week and requires exercises observing the week as designated by the Governor.

Various state agencies and municipalities may incur costs for engaging in the exercises designated by the Governor. The level of costs for affected agencies and municipalities will be dependent upon the location, nature, and size of exercises.
