**AN ACT CONCERNING MEDICAID PROVIDER AUDITS.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That subsection (d) of section 17b-99 of the general statutes be
- 2 amended to establish: (1) Clear parameters governing the use of
- 3 extrapolation in Medicaid provider audits, (2) specific minimum
- 4 standards for statistical sampling, including a minimum error rate and

5 types of statistical sampling that may be used, (3) acceptable methods  
6 by which providers may challenge extrapolated findings of  
7 overpayment, and (4) requirements concerning transparency, outreach  
8 and education by the Department of Social Services to reduce provider  
9 errors.

To ensure that audits of Medicaid providers are conducted in a fair and reasonable manner.
