working on myself through CCAR. I support everything CCAR offers to the community, and I hope to

see it expand to support the whole of Connecticut.

Expanding the resources CCAR has will allow this recovery network to reach everyone who needs it

here in CT, and those resources heavily depend on the continued support of the CT DHMAS. I urge

the committee to support ongoing and extended funding for the DHMAS so that CCAR can continue

to provide the recovery support services to the communities it serves, and expand into surrounding

areas.
