'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ROLE OF BIRTH-TO-THREE SERVICE PROVIDERS AT PLANNING AND PLACEMENT TEAM MEETINGS', to (1) allow parents at planning and placement team meetings to request the attendance and participation of their child's birth-to-three service coordinator and that the recommendations of such child's birth-to-three service provider be addressed, and (2) protect birth-to-three service providers from discipline for making recommendations for special education services at planning and placement team meetings.

H.B. No. 5329 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES TO SUBMIT A REPORT CONCERNING IMPLEMENTATION OF CERTAIN PROCESSES', to require the Department of Children and Families to submit a progress report concerning the implementation of the processes developed by the department to collect and provide certain information.

H.B. No. 5330 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT CONCERNING EARLY CHILDHOOD IMMUNIZATION DATA', to require the Department of Public Health to distribute an immunization survey to each child care center, group child care home and family child care home, determine as to each child care center whether herd immunity exists with respect to certain infectious diseases and publish such determinations on the department's Internet web site.

H.B. No. 5331 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT REQUIRING A SURVEY OF COURT-INVOLVED YOUTHS', to require the Court Support Services Division of the Judicial Branch to conduct a survey of youths who interface with the court system or receive services through the Judicial Branch in order to ascertain the need for additional or improved services for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer youths.

H.B. No. 5332 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY OF THE TIMELINESS OF REPORTS AND FAILURE TO REPORT BY MANDATED REPORTERS', to require the Department of Children and Families to conduct a study of the timeliness of reports and failure to report by mandated reporters.

H.B. No. 5333 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEY', to require (1) the Department of Public Health to administer the national Youth Risk Behavior Survey, (2) high schools to participate in the survey, if selected, and (3) the Child Advocate to develop questions assessing the risk to youths of being victims of sexual assault or misconduct by an adult.

H.B. No. 5334 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ONLINE SALE AND DELIVERY OF ELECTRONIC NICOTINE DELIVERY SYSTEMS AND VAPOR PRODUCTS', to require online sellers of electronic nicotine delivery systems and vapor products to require purchasers of such systems and products to (1) provide identification at the time of purchase, and (2) ensure that the name on such identification matches the name on the method of payment used to make the purchase.

H.B. No. 5335 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE PROVISION OF INFORMATION CONCERNING CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE', to require the Department of Children and Families to develop and operators of youth athletic activities to distribute information concerning appropriate interactions with children and child sexual abuse to youth coaches, participants in youth athletic activities and parents or guardians of such participants.

H.B. No. 5336 (RAISED) COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN. 'AN ACT REQUIRING BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF LICENSED YOUTH CAMPS', to require licensed youth camp employees who are eighteen years of age or older to submit to a comprehensive background check.

H.B. No. 5337 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROCESSING OF RABBITS FOR CONSUMPTION', to provide a means for the processing of rabbits in the state for consumption by consumers and retail food establishments.

H.B. No. 5338 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ANIMAL FIGHTING PARAPHERNALIA', to prohibit the sale of items that are used for animal fighting.

H.B. No. 5339 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE RELEASE OF HELIUM BALLOONS INTO THE ATMOSPHERE', to prohibit the knowing release of helium balloons into the atmosphere.

H.B. No. 5340 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE MODERNIZATION OF THE CONNECTICUT BOTTLE REDEMPTION PROGRAM', to modernize the functioning of the Connecticut Bottle Bill by expanding its coverage and increasing certain fees paid pursuant to the bottle redemption program.

H.B. No. 5341 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE AND BREEDING OF CERTAIN CETACEANS', to prohibit the sale and breeding of certain cetaceans.

H.B. No. 5342 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING MULTI-STREAM RECYCLING', to provide for multi-stream recycling in order to establish marketable streams for recycled materials and lessen the effects of such materials on the state's solid waste stream.

H.B. No. 5343 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING LOCAL REPRESENTATION ON THE CONNECTICUT SITING COUNCIL FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS', to allow for local representation on the Siting Council for certain proceedings involving electric distribution companies.

REF. ENVIRONMENT

H.B. No. 5344 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING OFF-SHORE DRILLING FOR OIL AND GAS IN CONNECTICUT', to prohibit off-shore drilling for oil and gas and the mapping for such oil in the coastal waters of the state.

H.B. No. 5345 (RAISED) ENVIRONMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING STATE REVIEW OF FARMLAND PRESERVATION TRANSACTIONS', to eliminate the State Property Review Board's review of Farmland Preservation Program transactions in order to expedite their occurrence.

REF. ENVIRONMENT

H.B. No. 5346 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING RESIDENTIAL SEWER USE CHARGES DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS', to set the charges for a residential user's connection with and use of a sewerage system during the summer months at an amount based upon the average volume of water discharged to the sewerage system during the nonsummer months.

REF. ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY

H.B. No. 5347 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A VOLUMETRIC SURCHARGE STUDY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT', to require a study on current nonbypassable surcharges or combined public benefit charges, and the impact such charges have on large commercial and industrial customers and small commercial and industrial customers.

H.B. No. 5348 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE STUDY OF COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION', to require a study of community choice aggregation programs by the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection.

REF. ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY

H.B. No. 5349 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE OWNERSHIP OF CERTAIN SOLAR ENERGY PROJECTS BY ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION COMPANIES', to allow electric distribution companies to submit proposals to the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection to own solar power generation facilities up to an aggregate of fifty megawatts.

H.B. No. 5350 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NATURAL GAS INFRASTRUCTURE', to (1) allow the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection to solicit proposals for the supply of biogas for injection into the natural gas distribution system in the state, (2) require the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to reopen or initiate dockets for the sole purpose of evaluating whether a gas company should accelerate its existing schedule for the repair and replacement of aging infrastructure, (3) allow the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to set rates to protect the interests of ratepayers and ensure revenue recovery for gas companies, and (4) require construction contractors to pay not less than the prevailing rate of wage to individuals who perform construction activities with respect to the replacement of a gas company's natural gas distribution infrastructure.

REF. ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY

H.B. No. 5351 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CERTAIN PROGRAMS AND TO INCENTIVIZE AND IMPLEMENT ELECTRIC ENERGY STORAGE RESOURCES', to (1) state the policy of the state to encourage the deployment of one thousand megawatts of electric energy storage by December 31, 2030, (2) initiate a program and associated funding for electric energy storage resources connected to the electric distribution system, and (3) permit the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection to solicit proposals for demonstration projects that are collocated with electric energy storage derived from Class I renewable energy sources.

H.B. No. 5352 (RAISED) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CLIMATE ADAPTATION STRATEGIES AT PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION', to require public institutions of higher education to develop and implement strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions on their campuses by forty-five per cent by the January 1, 2030.

H.B. No. 5353 (RAISED) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT FUNDING THE DEBT-FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROGRAM', to appropriate sixteen million dollars to the debt-free community college program and to establish an account for such program into which will be deposited state appropriations and any moneys received from any online offering of lottery draw games.

H.B. No. 5354 (RAISED) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT ALLOWING A PERSONAL INCOME TAX DEDUCTION OR AN ESTATE TAX CREDIT FOR A SCHOLARSHIP DONATION', to allow either a personal income tax deduction or an estate tax credit for a donation to an endowment fund established by the Connecticut Higher Education Supplemental Loan Authority for the benefit of the Roberta B. Willis Scholarship program.

H.B. No. 5355 (RAISED) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES', to require institutions of higher education in the state to adopt a policy on freedom of expression.

H.B. No. 5356 (RAISED) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS', to establish a task force to study the feasibility of establishing a pathways in technology early college high school program in alliance districts which would enroll students from surrounding towns.

REF. HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT

H.B. No. 5357 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY AND LIKELY EFFECTS OF MANDATING COVERAGE FOR CERTAIN BENEFITS UNDER MEDICARE SUPPLEMENT INSURANCE POLICIES AND CERTIFICATES', to require the Insurance Commissioner to study the feasibility and likely effects of mandating coverage for certain benefits under Medicare supplement insurance policies and certificates.

H.B. No. 5358 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE', to establish a task force to study property and casualty insurance.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5359 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY HEALTH INSURANCE', to establish a task force to study health insurance.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5360 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGULATION AND TAXATION OF TRAVEL INSURANCE AND ASSOCIATED ENTITIES, PRODUCTS AND PROFESSIONALS', to provide for the regulation and taxation of travel insurance, and associated entities, products and professionals, in this state.

H.B. No. 5361 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT LIMITING CHANGES TO PRESCRIPTION DRUG FORMULARIES AND LISTS OF COVERED DRUGS', to limit the circumstances in which a health carrier may remove a prescription drug from a drug formulary or list of covered drugs, or move a prescription drug to a different cost-sharing tier, during a plan year.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5362 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE AND DISCRIMINATION AGAINST VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE', to (1) prohibit property and casualty insurers from discriminating against an individual solely because the individual is a victim of domestic violence, and (2) provide that such discrimination constitutes a violation of the Connecticut Unfair Insurance Practices Act.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5363 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO STUDY THIRD-PARTY HEALTH INSURANCE AND MEDICARE MARKETING', to require the Insurance Commissioner to study the marketing practices of third parties that generate revenue from referral fees paid to such entities based on Medicare-related and health insurance leads generated in this state.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5364 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING MANDATED HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFIT REVIEW', to alter the manner in which the General Assembly enacts new mandated health insurance benefits.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5365 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT'S RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE PUBLIC HEALTH FEE, THIRD PARTY PERFORMANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S EMPLOYEES' DUTIES, THE INSURANCE DATA SECURITY LAW AND ASSESSMENTS AGAINST DOMESTIC INSURANCE COMPANIES AND ENTITIES', to (1) modify reporting requirements, and impose a late filing fee and penalty, concerning the public health fee, (2) permit attorneys, actuaries, accountants and experts to perform certain duties currently performed by the Insurance Department's employees, (3) modify the Insurance Data Security Law, and (4) modify the payment schedule for assessments against domestic insurance companies and other domestic entities.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5366 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE COST OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS', to: (1) Cap aggregate monthly cost-sharing for prescription drugs covered under certain individual and group health insurance policies; (2) cap the cost of generic drugs in this state; (3) require the Commissioner of Consumer Protection to submit a request to the federal Secretary of Health and Human Services to implement a Canadian prescription drug reimportation program in this state and, if the secretary approves such request, implement such program in this state; (4) require pharmaceutical manufacturers to send notice to the Insurance Commissioner regarding "pay-for-delay" agreements, and require health carriers and pharmacy benefits managers to reduce the cost of brand name prescription drugs that are the subject of such agreements; (5) establish a Critical Drug Shortage Review Board; and (6) limit the circumstances in which a health carrier may remove a prescription drug from a drug formulary or list of covered drugs, or move a prescription drug to a different cost-sharing tier, during a plan year.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5367 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE POLICIES AND COVERAGE FOR THE PERIL OF COLLAPSE', to require homeowners insurance policies to provide coverage for the peril of collapse and mitigation undertaken to prevent all or part of the covered dwelling from falling down or caving in.

H.B. No. 5368 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE USE OF BREED OF DOG AS AN UNDERWRITING FACTOR FOR HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE POLICIES', to establish a task force to study the use of breed of dog as an underwriting factor for homeowners insurance policies delivered, issued for delivery, renewed, amended or endorsed in this state.

H.B. No. 5369 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING DONOR BREAST MILK AND HUMAN MILK PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM DONOR BREAST MILK', to: (1) Require certain group health insurance policies to provide coverage for pasteurized donor breast milk and human milk products derived from donor breast milk; (2) require the Commissioner of Public Health to establish a program to regulate the donation, processing and distribution of donor breast milk and human milk products derived from donor breast milk; and (3) require the Commissioner of Social Services, to the extent permissible under federal law, to provide Medicaid coverage for pasteurized donor breast milk and human milk products derived from donor breast milk.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5370 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CRUMBLING CONCRETE FOUNDATIONS', to: (1) Extend the sunset date for Connecticut Foundation Solutions Indemnity Company, Inc.; and (2) require the Insurance Commissioner to study methods available to accelerate responses by insurers to claims under homeowners insurance policies for foundation deterioration due to the presence of pyrrhotite.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5371 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING COVERAGE FOR THE REMOVAL OF TREES FROM REAL PROPERTY', to provide that insurers that are licensed to write homeowners or commercial property insurance in this state may provide coverage for the removal of trees that fall onto covered real property due to a natural disaster.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5372 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING INSURANCE COMPANIES FROM USING CREDIT HISTORY AS A FACTOR IN UNDERWRITING OR RATING PRIVATE PASSENGER NONFLEET AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE POLICIES', to prohibit insurance companies from using an applicant's or insured's credit history as a factor in underwriting or rating private passenger nonfleet automobile insurance policies.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5373 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING HOME IMPROVEMENT CONTRACTORS AND SALESPERSONS', to: (1) Modify both the permissible and required terms of home improvement contracts; (2) preclude home improvement contractors from engaging in certain conduct to induce owners to enter into home improvement contracts; (3) require home improvement contractors to notify the commissioner regarding changes in their business names, trade names and addresses; (4) require home improvement contractors to maintain insurance coverage; (5) expand the required content of the application for a certificate of registration as a home improvement contractor; and (6) modify the grounds on which the Commissioner of Consumer Protection may (A) reprimand or place a home improvement contractor or salesperson on probation, or (B) revoke, suspend, or refuse to issue or renew a certificate of registration as a home improvement contractor or salesperson.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5374 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN INSUREDS FROM THE INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX', to exempt certain insureds insured by an association captive insurance company from the insurance premium tax.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5375 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR REAL ESTATE BROKERS', to modify the preconditions to issuing a real estate broker's license in this state.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

H.B. No. 5376 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF EDTPA AS PART OF EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS', to cease implementation of edTPA in the state and require each educator preparation program to develop and implement its own preservice performance assessment.

H.B. No. 5377 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT PERMITTING A SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PAY TUITION FOR SENDING ITS ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS TO ANOTHER DISTRICT', to allow a board of education to pay tuition to another school district for sending its elementary and middle school students to such other school district.

REF. EDUCATION

H.B. No. 5378 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE INTEGRATION OF SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING IN PROGRAMS OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR EDUCATORS IN CONNECTICUT', to integrate the principles and practices of social-emotional learning in the program of professional development for educators in the state.

REF. EDUCATION

H.B. No. 5379 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ALLOCATION OF SLOTS FOR STATE-FUNDED CHILD CARE CENTERS', to allow certain operators of a child care center to allocate up to thirty per cent of the spaces at such center to children who are members of families with incomes above seventy-five per cent of the state median income.

H.B. No. 5380 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING SCHOOL LITERACY', to expand the intensive reading instruction program to include grades four and five, and to establish the Center for Literacy Research and Reading Success within the Department of Education.

H.B. No. 5381 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PUBLIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS AND FORCED ARBITRATION AGREEMENTS', to allow employees to sue employers on behalf of the state after having waived their personal rights to sue by signing forced arbitration agreements.

H.B. No. 5382 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING EMPLOYEE LEAVE FOR DISASTER RELIEF VOLUNTEER SERVICE', to allow employees to volunteer for disaster relief service with nonprofit organizations without loss of vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime accumulation.

H.B. No. 5383 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DISCLOSURE OF SALARY RANGE FOR A VACANT POSITION', to require employers to disclose salary ranges for vacant positions and to provide comparable pay for comparable work.

H.B. No. 5384 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT MAKING MINOR AND TECHNICAL CHANGES TO LABOR DEPARTMENT STATUTES', to make minor and technical changes to Labor Department statutes.

H.B. No. 5385 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT ENSURING FAIR AND EQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL WORK', to ensure fair and equal pay for equal work.

REF. LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES

H.B. No. 5386 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ISSUANCE OF A STOP WORK ORDER', to increase penalties for violating a stop work order.

H.B. No. 5387 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING WORKERS' COMPENSATION BENEFITS FOR MEMBERS OF UNDERWATER SEARCH AND RESCUE TEAMS AND CANINE SEARCH AND RESCUE TEAMS', to provide workers' compensation coverage for members of underwater search and rescue teams and canine search and rescue teams.

H.B. No. 5388 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CREATING A RESPECTFUL AND OPEN WORLD FOR NATURAL HAIR', to prohibit discrimination on the basis of ethnic hairstyles historically associated with race, by adopting what is commonly referred to as the CROWN Act.

H.B. No. 5389 (RAISED) LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING COLLATERAL CONSEQUENCES OF A CRIMINAL RECORD', to protect individuals from discrimination based on criminal history record information.

REF. LABOR AND PUBLIC EMPLOYEES

H.B. No. 5390 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DUTY TO RETREAT IN A HOUSE OF RELIGIOUS WORSHIP', to eliminate the requirement that a person in a house of religious worship retreat before using deadly physical force to defend himself or herself or a third person.

REF. JUDICIARY

H.B. No. 5391 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY THAT IS EXEMPT FROM A JUDGMENT CREDITOR', to increase the value of certain personal and real property that shall be exempt from a judgment creditor and to provide that the cash surrender value of life insurance policies shall also be exempt from a judgment creditor.

H.B. No. 5392 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE IMPOSITION OF PENALTIES FOR REPEATED VIOLATIONS OF MUNICIPAL REGULATIONS OR ORDINANCES', to improve a municipality's code enforcement provisions and reduce the number of repeat offenders.

H.B. No. 5393 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE JURY ADMINISTRATOR IN SUMMONING JURORS', to better ensure that the composition of a jury is reflective of the overall population within the judicial district.

H.B. No. 5394 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT PERMITTING THE COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTION TO ACCEPT SERVICE OF PROCESS ON BEHALF OF AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION', to permit the Commissioner of Correction to accept service of process on behalf of an employee of the department who is named as a defendant in a civil action in his or her individual capacity.

H.B. No. 5395 (RAISED) PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ADVANCED DEPOSIT WAGERING', to delete a provision on the date of transfer of the off-track betting system and repeal the provision governing advanced deposit wagering.

REF. PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY

H.B. No. 5396 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE MILITARY TRAINING EVALUATION CONDUCTED BY THE LABOR DEPARTMENT', to extend the time limit for veterans to apply to the Labor Department for a military training evaluation.

REF. VETERANS' AFFAIRS

H.B. No. 5397 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND BYLAWS OF THE MILITIA UNITS AND THE MAXIMUM RETIREMENT AGE FOR MEMBERS SERVING AS MUSICIANS IN BANDS OF THE GOVERNOR'S FOOT GUARDS', to require the Governor to determine the structure of the militia units and authorize the Adjutant General to issue bylaws for the militia, and to increase the maximum retirement age for members serving as musicians in bands of the Governor's Foot Guards.

H.B. No. 5399 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING VETERANS' INTERVIEWS FOR FILLING CERTAIN VACANCIES IN STATE AGENCIES', to require that all veterans listed on the candidate for original appointments list by the Commissioner of Administrative Services be granted an interview when filling original appointment vacancies within state agencies.

H.B. No. 5400 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING VETERAN-OWNED MICRO BUSINESSES', to provide veteran-owned micro businesses with economic opportunities.

H.B. No. 5401 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR GOLD STAR PARENTS AND SURVIVING SPOUSES', to require municipalities to provide a property tax exemption to eligible Gold Star parents and surviving spouses.

REF. VETERANS' AFFAIRS

H.B. No. 5402 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING RETALIATION OR DISCRIMINATION AGAINST AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS A VETERAN FOR EXCEEDING PAID SICK LEAVE', to protect employees who are veterans from retaliation or discrimination by their employers for exceeding the number of paid sick leave days.

H.B. No. 5403 (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT EXCLUDING CERTAIN VETERANS' BENEFITS WHEN DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS', to exclude certain veterans' benefits from income when determining eligibility for public assistance programs.
