Explanation

The bill requires the Department of Consumer Protection (DCP) to conduct a study on the Connecticut Lottery Corporation resulting in a cost in FY 22 of up to \$500,000 and to write regulations if sports wagering is legalized resulting in a potential cost of up to \$143,100 in FY 22.

To meet the requirements of the bill DCP will need to hire a consultant to conduct the study for a cost of up to \$500,000 and a durational project manager to write the sports wagering regulations for a cost of up to \$143,100 (cost includes salary and fringe benefits). The final costs will depend on the contract between DCP and the

¹The fringe benefit costs for most state employees are budgeted centrally in accounts administered by the Comptroller. The estimated active employee fringe benefit cost associated with most personnel changes is 41.3% of payroll in FY 22 and FY 23.

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consultant for the study, if sports wagering is legalized in the state and DCP is required to adopt regulations, and how long the durational project manager is needed.
