I am writing in opposition to **HB-5540 AAC CERTAIN AUTHORITIES OF THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE**
HB6325 AAC THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE, ABSENTEE BALLOTS AND ELECTION AUDITS.

I oppose **HB-5540** because it will replace centralized responsibility for elections with decentralized inefficient micromanagement of elections. What could you possibly be thinking about? we live in a democratic state and I wish it to remain so. This will undermine confidence in the election process and it will not allow the Secretary of the State the authority to react quickly as was done during the pandemic. I appreciate the changes made for the pandemic, don't tighten up.

It is essential that administration of elections remains centralized so that one person is accountable and so that when emergencies like a pandemic occur, that person can act quickly.

I oppose **HB6325** because it is a voter suppression bill. Its intention is to make absentee ballots less accessible and more likely to be invalidated and does so without sufficient protections for voters.
