Dear GAE Committee Co-Chairs Sen. Flexer and Rep. Fox, Vice Chairs Sen. Haskell and Rep. Thomas, and Ranking Members Sen. Sampson and Rep. Mastrofrancesco and Members of the GAE Committee,

Thank you for all you did this year to protect our right to vote. It is clear from the record high participation rate that absentee voting for all and the other steps taken to make voting convenient and safe were very important to voters in Connecticut. Nearly 35% of the population chose to vote by Absentee Ballot while those who wanted to vote in person were still able to do so. This is also supported by a recent CT public opinion poll conducted by Secure Democracy which showed widespread bi-partisan support for both Early Voting and Absentee Ballot Expansion.

I loved the ability to vote absentee during Covid-19 and the convenience of a ballot box outside Town Hall. I would like those options to be available for all future elections. I would also like the ability to vote early in person. CT legislators should let the voters decide if they want to make voting more convenient.

Please vote **YES** on **HJ 58** in **SUPPORT** of a **Resolution Proposing a State Constitutional Amendment to Allow No-Excuse Absentee Voting** which would allow **all** registered voters to choose to **vote by absentee ballot** and in **SUPPORT** of **HJ 59 Resolution Approving an Amendment to the State Constitution to Allow for Early Voting** which would allow all registered voters to choose to **vote early**.
