

I OPPOSE HJ 58 and HJ 59

Regarding HJ 58 Resolution Proposing a State Constitutional Amendment to Allow No-Excuse Absentee Voting please see the below personal example of potential election corruption

Prior to the last election (November, 2020), I received 3 unsolicited absentee ballot applications sent to my home; addressed to three different individuals; one being myself. The other two individuals have not lived here for many years. Without need for an ID, I could have forged the signature on the other two; sent them in and gotten three absentee ballots; voted three times and mailed them in; without the need for showing identification. Instead, I threw them all away, and voted in person, where my ID was required.

This situation occurred over and over at the last election; and you don't know how many people voted more than once. You don't even know if I am telling the truth and maybe I voted three times.

Regarding HJ 59 Resolution Approving an Amendment to the State Constitution to Allow for Early Voting, this is not required due to the current provision for absentee balloting.

Any ballot in which the person who casts it cannot have his or her identification verified is potentially a fraudulent vote. Both of these bills expand the possibility of this type of voter fraud.
