
Co-Chair Maroney, Co-Chair D’Agostino, and Members of the Committee:

The New England Convenience Store & Energy Marketers Association (NECSEMA) represents convenience store and gasoline retailers, independent transportation fuel distributors, and the businesses which supply them. According to the National Association of Convenience Stores, Connecticut is home to almost 1,700 convenience stores employing over 25,000 people.

NECSEMA supports SB 152. The pandemic highlighted the need to update existing laws given our collective efforts to minimize interaction and maintain social distancing. SB 152 will sensibly and fairly update requirements to allow suppliers of various fuels and oils to provide their customers delivery receipts electronically. This approach captures technological efficiencies, as well as protecting existing rights provided under the law, by allowing either party to opt out if they choose.
