Substitute Bill No. 6106



AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCES AND NONRESIDENTIAL HYDROPOWER FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subdivision (57) of section 12-81 of the general statutes is
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
3 *1, 2021, and applicable to assessment years commencing on or after October 1,*
4 *2021*):

5 (57) (A) (i) Any Class I renewable energy source, as defined in section
6 16-1, or hydropower facility described in subdivision (21) of subsection
7 (a) of section 16-1, installed for the generation of electricity where such
8 electricity is intended for private residential use or on a farm, as defined
9 in subsection (q) of section 1-1, provided (I) such installation occurs on
10 or after October 1, 2007, [and further provided] (II) the estimated annual
11 production of such source or facility does not exceed the estimated
12 annual load for the location where such source or facility is located,
13 where such load and production are estimated as of the date of
14 installation of the source or facility as indicated in the written
15 application filed pursuant to subparagraph (F) of this subdivision, and
16 (III) such installation is for a single family dwelling, a multifamily
17 dwelling consisting of two to four units or a farm; [.] (ii) any passive or
18 active solar water or space heating system; [.] or (iii) any geothermal

19 energy resource. In the case of clause (i) of this subparagraph, the
20 utilization of or participation in any net metering or tariff policy or
21 program implemented by the state or ownership of such source or
22 facility by a party other than the owner of the real property upon which
23 such source or facility is installed shall not disqualify such source or
24 facility from exemption pursuant to this section. In the case of clause (ii)
25 or (iii) of this subparagraph, such exemption shall apply only to the
26 amount by which the assessed valuation of the real property equipped
27 with such system or resource exceeds the assessed valuation of such real
28 property equipped with the conventional portion of the system or
29 resource;

30 (B) For assessment years commencing on and after October 1, 2013,
31 any Class I renewable energy source, as defined in section 16-1,
32 hydropower facility described in subdivision (21) of subsection (a) of
33 section 16-1, or solar thermal or geothermal renewable energy source,
34 installed for generation or displacement of energy, provided (i) such
35 installation occurs on or after January 1, 2010, (ii) such installation is for
36 commercial or industrial purposes, (iii) the nameplate capacity of such
37 source or facility does not exceed the load for the location where such
38 generation or displacement is located, and (iv) such source or facility is
39 located in a distressed municipality, as defined in section 32-9p, with a
40 population between one hundred twenty-five thousand and one
41 hundred thirty-five thousand;

42 (C) For assessment years commencing on and after October 1, 2013,
43 any municipality may, upon approval by its legislative body or in any
44 town in which the legislative body is a town meeting, by the board of
45 selectmen, abate up to one hundred per cent of property tax for any
46 Class I renewable energy source, as defined in section 16-1, hydropower
47 facility described in subdivision (21) of subsection (a) of section 16-1, or
48 solar thermal or geothermal renewable energy source, installed for
49 generation or displacement of energy, provided (i) such installation
50 occurs between January 1, 2010, and December 31, 2013, (ii) such
51 installation is for commercial or industrial purposes, (iii) the nameplate

52 capacity of such source or facility does not exceed the load for the
53 location where such generation or displacement is located, and (iv) such
54 source or facility is not located in a municipality described in
55 subparagraph (B) of this subdivision;

56 (D) For assessment years commencing on and after October 1, 2014,
57 any (i) Class I renewable energy source, as defined in section 16-1, (ii)
58 hydropower facility described in subdivision (21) of subsection (a) of
59 section 16-1, or (iii) solar thermal or geothermal renewable energy
60 source, installed for generation or displacement of energy, provided (I)
61 such installation occurs on or after January 1, 2014, (II) is for commercial
62 or industrial purposes, (III) the nameplate capacity of such source or
63 facility does not exceed the load for the location where such generation
64 or displacement is located or the aggregated load of the beneficial
65 accounts for any Class I renewable energy source participating in virtual
66 net metering pursuant to section 16-244u, and (IV) in the case of clause
67 (iii) of this subparagraph, such exemption shall apply only to the
68 amount by which the assessed valuation of the real property equipped
69 with such source exceeds the assessed valuation of such real property
70 equipped with the conventional portion of the source;

71 (E) For assessment years commencing on and after October 1, 2021,
72 any (i) Class I renewable energy source, as defined in section 16-1, (ii)
73 hydropower facility described in subdivision (21) of subsection (a) of
74 section 16-1, or (iii) solar thermal or geothermal renewable energy
75 source, installed for generation or displacement of energy, provided (I)
76 such installation occurred on or after January 1, 2014, (II) such
77 installation is for nonresidential purposes, (III) the estimated annual
78 production of such source or facility does not exceed the estimated
79 annual load for the location where such generation or displacement is
80 located or the aggregated load of the beneficial accounts for any Class I
81 renewable energy source participating in virtual net metering pursuant
82 to section 16-244u, where such load and production are estimated as of
83 the date of installation of the source or facility as indicated in the written
84 application filed pursuant to subparagraph (F) of this subdivision, and

85 (IV) in the case of clause (iii) of this subparagraph, such exemption shall
86 apply only to the amount by which the assessed valuation of the real
87 property equipped with such source exceeds the assessed valuation of
88 such real property equipped with the conventional portion of the
89 source;

90 ~~[(E)]~~ (E) Any person claiming the exemption provided in this
91 subdivision for any assessment year shall, on or before the first day of
92 November in such assessment year, file with the assessor or board of
93 assessors in the town in which such hydropower facility, Class I
94 renewable energy source, solar thermal or geothermal renewable
95 energy source or passive or active solar water or space heating system
96 or geothermal energy resource is located, a written application claiming
97 such exemption. Such application shall be made on a form prepared for
98 such purpose by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management,
99 and shall include, but not be limited to, a statement of the estimated
100 annual load and production of a source or facility described in clause (i)
101 of subparagraphs (A) and (E) of this subdivision as of the date of the
102 installation of such source or facility. Said secretary shall make such
103 application available to the public on the Internet web site of the Office
104 of Policy and Management. Failure to file such application in the
105 manner and form as provided by [such assessor or board] the secretary
106 within the time limit prescribed shall constitute a waiver of the right to
107 such exemption for such assessment year. Such application shall not be
108 required for any assessment year following that for which the initial
109 application is filed, provided if such hydropower facility, Class I
110 renewable energy source, solar thermal or geothermal renewable
111 energy source or passive or active solar water or space heating system
112 or geothermal energy resource is altered in a manner which would
113 require a building permit, such alteration shall be deemed a waiver of
114 the right to such exemption until a new application, applicable with
115 respect to such altered source, is filed and the right to such exemption is
116 established as required initially. In the event that a person owns more
117 than one such source or facility in a municipality, such person may file
118 a single application identifying each source or facility;

119 [(F)] (G) For assessment years commencing on and after October 1,
120 2015, any municipality may, by vote of its legislative body or, in a
121 municipality where the legislative body is a town meeting, by vote of
122 the board of selectmen, abate up to one hundred per cent of the property
123 taxes due for any tax year, for not longer than the term of the power
124 purchase agreement, with respect to any Class I renewable energy
125 source, as defined in section 16-1, that is the subject of such power
126 purchase agreement approved by the Public Utilities Regulatory
127 Authority pursuant to section 16a-3f;

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
