We started in the Guinea refugee camp, the Ivory Coast refugee camp, and then the Ghana refugee camp, and then finally we came to the United States.

At Norwalk Community College I am taking classes part-time for an accounting certificate, and I will be finishing it in May of 2022. I wanted to refresh my accounting skills so that I can continue for my master's degree in Accounting and become a certified public accountant. I currently have a Batchelor's degree in International Business, with an accounting minor, from Fairfield University. While I was earning my Batchelor's degree, I was also playing at a Division 1 Soccer program which was very time consuming and did not allow me the time to do internships during my academic journey.
