AN ACT CONCERNING VARIOUS REVISIONS TO THE HIGHER EDUCATION STATUTES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2022) (a) Not later than January 1, 2023, each governing board of an independent institution of higher 3 education in the state shall establish a policy requiring that any new 4 member of such governing board, who has not previously served on 5 such governing board, receive instruction and training in (1) financial management of institutions of higher education, (2) legal and fiduciary 6 responsibilities of a member of such governing board, and (3) applicable 8 standards for accreditation of institutions of higher education and 9 programs of higher learning. A new member shall complete such 10 instruction and training not later than one year after joining a governing 11 board.
- 12 (b) Not later than January 1, 2023, each independent institution of 13 higher education shall post on its Internet web site (1) the policy 14 established by its governing board pursuant to subsection (a) of this

section, and (2) a summary of the instruction and training received by the members of its governing board in accordance with such policy.

Sec. 2. (NEW) (Effective July 1, 2022) (a) Not later than January 1, 2023, the Board of Regents for Higher Education and the Board of Trustees of The University of Connecticut shall each adopt a policy requiring that any new member of either of said boards receive instruction and training in (1) a board member's duties to the state and the public institution of higher education governed by the board, (2) each committee of the board, including, but not limited to, the executive committee, and its functions, (3) professional accounting and reporting standards, (4) methods for meeting the statutory, regulatory and fiduciary obligations of the board, (5) the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, as defined in section 1-200 of the general statutes, (6) a board member's institutional and statutory ethical responsibilities, (7) the development and implementation of institutional policies, (8) business operations, administration, budgeting, financing, financial reporting, financial reserves and endowment managing relevant to institutions of higher education, (9) student tuition, mandatory fees and student debt trends, (10) oversight of planning, construction, maintenance, expansion and renovation projects that impact the infrastructure, physical facilities and natural environment of the public institution of higher education governed by the board, (11) workforce planning, strategy and investment, (12) institutional advancement, including, but not limited to, philanthropic giving, fundraising initiatives, alumni programming, communications and media, government and public relations and community affairs, (13) student welfare issues, including, but not limited to, academic studies, curriculum, residence life, student governance and activities and the general physical and mental well-being of students, (14) current and anticipated issues in higher education, and (15) any other topics each governing board deems necessary. A member shall complete such instruction and training not later than one year after being appointed or elected to either of said boards.

(b) Not later than January 1, 2023, each public institution of higher

- Sec. 3. Section 10a-8 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):
- 55 (a) The provisions of sections 4-77 and 4-78 shall not apply to the 56 constituent units of the state system of higher education, and for the 57 purposes of said sections only, the Board of Regents for Higher 58 Education shall be deemed the budgeted agency for the Connecticut 59 State University System, the regional community-technical college 60 system, [and] Charter Oak State College and the central office of the 61 Connecticut State Colleges and Universities. The Board of Regents for 62 Higher Education shall develop a formula or program-based budgeting 63 system to be used by each institution in preparing operating budgets. 64 The Board of Regents for Higher Education shall prepare a single 65 budget request itemized by the Connecticut State University System, the 66 regional community-technical college system, [and] Charter Oak State 67 College and the central office of the Connecticut State Colleges and 68 Universities using the formula or program-based budgeting system and 69 shall submit such budget request displaying all operating funds to the 70 Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management in accordance with 71 sections 4-77 and 4-78, subject to procedures developed by the Board of 72 Regents for Higher Education and approved by said secretary. The 73 budget request shall set forth, in the form prescribed by the Board of 74 Regents for Higher Education, a proposed expenditure plan which shall 75 include: (1) The total amount requested for such appropriation account; 76 (2) the amount to be appropriated from the General Fund; and (3) the 77 amount to be paid from the tuition revenues of the regional community-78 technical college system, [and] the Connecticut State University System 79 and Charter Oak State College. After review and comment by the Board 80 of Regents for Higher Education, the proposed expenditure plans shall 81 be incorporated into the single public higher education budget request 82 including recommendations, if any, by said board. Any tuition increase

83 proposed by the regional community-technical college system, [and] the 84 Connecticut State University System and Charter Oak State College for 85 the fiscal year to which the budget request relates shall be included in 86 the single public higher education budget request submitted by the 87 Board of Regents for Higher Education for such fiscal year, provided if 88 the General Assembly does not appropriate the amount requested by 89 any such system or college, such system or college may increase tuition 90 and fees by an amount greater than that included in the budget request 91 in response to which the appropriation was made. The General Assembly shall make appropriations directly to the constituent units. 92 93 Allotment reductions made pursuant to the provisions of subsections 94 (b) and (c) of section 4-85 shall be applied by the Board of Regents for 95 Higher Education among the appropriations to the constituent units and 96 the central office of the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities 97 without regard to the limitations on reductions provided in said section, 98 except that said limitations shall apply to the total of the amounts 99 appropriated. The Board of Regents for Higher Education shall apply 100 such reductions after consultation with the Secretary of the Office of 101 Policy and Management. Any reductions of more than five per cent of 102 the appropriations of any constituent units shall be submitted to the 103 appropriations committee which shall, within thirty days, approve or 104 reject such reduction.

(b) The boards of trustees of each of the constituent units may transfer to or from any specific appropriation of such constituent unit a sum or sums totaling up to fifty thousand dollars or ten per cent of any such specific appropriation, whichever is less, in any fiscal year without the consent of the Finance Advisory Committee. Any such transfer shall be reported to the Finance Advisory Committee within thirty days of such transfer and such report shall be a record of said committee.

Sec. 4. Subsection (b) of section 10a-77 of the 2022 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):

(b) The Board of [Trustees of the Community-Technical Colleges]

Regents for Higher Education shall establish and administer a fund to be known as the Regional Community-Technical Colleges Operating Fund. Appropriations from general revenues of the state and, upon request by the board and with an annual review and approval by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, the amount of the appropriations for fringe benefits and workers' compensation applicable to the <u>regional</u> community-technical colleges pursuant to subsection (a) of section 4-73, shall be transferred from the Comptroller, and all tuition revenue received by the regional community-technical colleges in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of this section shall be deposited in said fund. Income from student fees or related charges; the proceeds of auxiliary activities and business enterprises, gifts and donations; federal funds and grants for purposes other than research, and all receipts derived from the conduct by the colleges of their education extension programs and summer school sessions shall be credited to said fund but shall be allocated to the central office and institutional operating accounts which shall be established and maintained for the central office and each community-technical college. If the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management disapproves such transfer, the secretary may require the amount of the appropriation for operating expenses to be used for personal services and fringe benefits to be excluded from said fund. The State Treasurer shall review and approve the transfer prior to such request by the board. [of trustees.] The board shall establish an equitable policy, in accordance with section 10a-8, as amended by this act, for allocation of appropriations from general revenues of the state, fringe benefits transferred from the Comptroller and tuition revenue deposited in the Regional Community-Technical Colleges Operating Fund. At the beginning of each quarter of the fiscal year, the board shall allocate and transfer, in accordance with said policy, moneys for expenditure in such institutional operating accounts, exclusive of amounts retained for central office operations and reasonable reserves for future distribution. All costs of waiving or remitting tuition pursuant to subsection (f) of this section shall be charged to the Regional Community-Technical Colleges Operating Fund. Repairs, alterations or additions to facilities supported

151 by operating funds and costing one million dollars or more shall require 152 the approval of the General Assembly, or when the General Assembly 153 is not in session, of the Finance Advisory Committee. Any balance of 154 receipts above expenditures shall remain in said fund, except such sums 155 as may be required for deposit into a debt service fund or the General 156 Fund for further payment by the Treasurer of debt service on general 157 obligation bonds of the state issued for purposes of the regional 158 community-technical colleges.

Sec. 5. Subsection (b) of section 10a-99 of the 2022 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):

(b) The Board of [Trustees of the Connecticut State University System] Regents for Higher Education shall establish and administer a fund to be known as the Connecticut State University System Operating Fund. Appropriations from general revenues of the state and upon request by the Connecticut State University System and with the annual review and approval by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, the amount of the appropriations for fringe benefits pursuant to subsection (a) of section 4-73, shall be transferred from the State Comptroller and all tuition revenue received by the Connecticut State University System in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of this section shall be deposited in said fund. Income from student fees or related charges, the proceeds of auxiliary activities and business enterprises, gifts and donations, federal funds and grants, subject to the provisions of sections 10a-98 to 10a-98g, inclusive, and all receipts derived from the conduct by a state university of its education extension program and its summer school session shall be credited to said fund but shall be allocated to the central office and institutional operating accounts which shall be established and maintained for the central office and each state university. Any such gifts and donations, federal funds and grants for purposes of research shall be allocated to separate accounts within such central office and institutional operating accounts. If the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management disapproves such transfer, [he] the secretary may require the amount of the

appropriation for operating expenses to be used for personal services and fringe benefits to be excluded from said fund. The State Treasurer shall review and approve the transfer prior to such request by the university. The board [of trustees] shall establish an equitable policy, in accordance with section 10a-8, as amended by this act, for allocation of appropriations from general revenues of the state, fringe benefits transferred from the State Comptroller and tuition revenue deposited in the Connecticut State University System Operating Fund. At the beginning of each quarter of the fiscal year, the board shall allocate and transfer, in accordance with said policy, moneys for expenditure in such institutional operating accounts, exclusive of amounts retained for central office operations and reasonable reserves for future distribution. All costs of waiving or remitting tuition pursuant to subsection (f) of this section shall be charged to the Connecticut State University System Operating Fund. Repairs, alterations or additions to facilities supported by the Connecticut State University System Operating Fund and costing one million dollars or more shall require the approval of the General Assembly, or when the General Assembly is not in session, of the Finance Advisory Committee. Any balance of receipts above expenditures shall remain in said fund, except such sums as may be required for deposit into a debt service fund or the General Fund for further payment by the Treasurer of debt service on general obligation bonds of the state issued for purposes of the Connecticut State University System.
