"AN ACT CONCERNING VARIOUS REVISIONS TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH STATUTES."

1 Strike sections 1 and 7 in their entirety and renumber the remaining
2 sections and internal references accordingly

3 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
4 internal references accordingly:

5 "Sec. 501. Section 20-633 of the general statutes is repealed and the
6 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2022*):

7 (a) Any person licensed as a pharmacist under part II of this chapter
8 may (1) administer, to an adult, any vaccine, approved by the United
9 States Food and Drug Administration that is listed on the National
10 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Adult Immunization
11 Schedule, and (2) on and after July 1, 2022, administer to any person
12 between the ages of twelve and seventeen, with the consent of such
13 person's parent or guardian, the influenza vaccine approved by the
14 United States Food and Drug Administration, provided the

15 administration of any [such] vaccine under this subsection is conducted
16 pursuant to the order of a licensed health care provider and in
17 accordance with the regulations established pursuant to subsection (b)
18 of this section.

19 (b) The Commissioner of Consumer Protection, in consultation with
20 the Commissioner of Public Health and the Commission of Pharmacy,
21 shall adopt regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54,
22 to implement the provisions of this section. Such regulations shall (1)
23 require any pharmacist who administers a vaccine [to an adult]
24 pursuant to this section to successfully complete an immunization
25 training program for pharmacists; (2) define the basic requirements of
26 such training program, which shall include training and instruction in
27 pre-administration education and screening, vaccine storage and
28 handling, subcutaneous and intramuscular injections, recordkeeping,
29 vaccine safety, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, basic cardiac life support
30 and adverse event reporting; (3) identify qualifying training programs,
31 which are accredited by the National Centers for Disease Control
32 Prevention, the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education or other
33 appropriate national accrediting body; and (4) establish a system of
34 control and reporting.

35 (c) For purposes of this section, "adult" means [an individual] a
36 person who has attained the age of eighteen years.

37 Sec. 502. Subsection (a) of section 47 of house bill 5500 of the current
38 session, as amended by House Amendment Schedule "A", is repealed
39 and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2022*):

40 (a) For purposes of this section, "clinical medical assistant" means a
41 person who (1) (A) is certified by the American Association of Medical
42 Assistants, the National Healthcareer Association, the National Center
43 for Competency Testing or the American Medical Technologists, and (B)
44 has graduated from a postsecondary medical assisting program (i) on
45 and after January 1, 2023, that is accredited by the Commission on
46 Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs, the Accrediting

47 Bureau of Health Education Schools or another accrediting organization
48 recognized by the United States Department of Education, or (ii) offered
49 by an institution of higher education accredited by an accrediting
50 organization recognized by the United States Department of Education
51 and that includes a total of seven hundred twenty hours, including one
52 hundred sixty hours of clinical practice skills, including, but not limited
53 to, administering injections, or (2) has completed relevant medical
54 assistant training provided by any branch of the armed forces of the
55 United States."
