House Bill No. 6694

House of Representatives, March 16, 2023

The Committee on General Law reported through REP. D'AGOSTINO of the 91st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY CONSUMER PROTECTION IN THIS STATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a task force
2 to study consumer protection in this state.
- 3 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- 4 (1) Two appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 5 (2) Two appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate;
- 6 (3) One appointed by the majority leader of the House of
7 Representatives;
- 8 (4) One appointed by the majority leader of the Senate;
- 9 (5) One appointed by the minority leader of the House of
10 Representatives;

11 (6) One appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; and

12 (7) The Commissioner of Consumer Protection, or the commissioner's
13 designee.

14 (c) Any member of the task force appointed under subdivision (1),
15 (2), (3), (4), (5) or (6) of subsection (b) of this section may be a member
16 of the General Assembly.

17 (d) All initial appointments to the task force shall be made not later
18 than thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall
19 be filled by the appointing authority.

20 (e) The speaker of the House of Representatives and the president pro
21 tempore of the Senate shall select the chairpersons of the task force from
22 among the members of the task force. Such chairpersons shall schedule
23 the first meeting of the task force, which shall be held not later than sixty
24 days after the effective date of this section.

25 (f) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the
26 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to consumer
27 protection shall serve as administrative staff of the task force.

28 (g) Not later than January 1, 2024, the task force shall submit a report
29 on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of
30 the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
31 consumer protection, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a
32 of the general statutes. The task force shall terminate on the date that it
33 submits such report or January 1, 2024, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
