## AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF A GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM ON A SCHOOL BUS AND THE SHORTAGE OF SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 14-296aa of the general statutes is
- 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*,
- 3 2023):

- 4 (c) No person shall use a hand-held mobile telephone or other
  - electronic device, including those with hands-free accessories, or a
- 6 mobile electronic device while operating a school bus that is carrying
- 7 passengers, except that this subsection shall not apply when such
- 8 person: (1) [places] Places an emergency call to school officials; [,] (2)
- 9 uses a hand-held mobile telephone as provided in subparagraph (A) of
- subdivision (4) of subsection (b) of this section; [, or] (3) uses a hand-
- 11 held mobile telephone or mobile electronic device in a manner similar
- 12 to a two-way radio to allow real-time communication with a school
- 13 official, an emergency response operator, a hospital, physician's office
- 14 or health clinic, an ambulance company, a fire department or a police
- 15 department; or (4) uses a mobile electronic device that has a video
- 16 <u>display area of not more than thirteen inches nor less than nine inches</u>

- 17 measured diagonally, provided such device (A) is used as a global
- 18 positioning system or to provide navigation, (B) is securely attached to
- 19 the dashboard of such school bus, and (C) cannot be removed from such
- 20 <u>dashboard or used to engage in a call or type, read or send text or a text</u>
- 21 message while such school bus is in operation.
- Sec. 2. Subsection (b) of section 14-276a of the general statutes is
- repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*,
- 24 2023):
- 25 (b) No person shall operate a school bus, as defined in section 14-275,
- 26 <u>as amended by this act</u>, or a student transportation vehicle, as defined
- 27 in section 14-212, for the purpose of transporting school children unless
- such person has prior to the issuance or renewal of such person's license
- 29 endorsement: (1) Furnished evidence to the satisfaction of the
- 30 commissioner that such person meets the physical qualification
- 31 standards established in 49 CFR 391, as amended from time to time; and
- 32 (2) successfully completed a course in safety training and, in the case of
- 33 school bus operators, passed an examination in proficiency in school bus
- 34 operation given by the commissioner. Such proficiency examination
- 35 shall include a road test administered in either a type I school bus
- 36 having a gross vehicle weight exceeding ten thousand pounds or a type
- 37 II school bus having a gross vehicle weight of ten thousand pounds or
- 38 less. The commissioner shall prioritize scheduling a road test for
- persons seeking or renewing a public passenger endorsement to operate
- 40 <u>a school bus.</u> Any operator administered a road test in a type II school
- 41 bus shall not be eligible for a license to operate a type I school bus. Any
- 42 person who violates any provision of this subsection shall be deemed to
- 43 have committed an infraction.
- Sec. 3. (Effective from passage) On and after July 1, 2023, and until
- 45 November 27, 2024, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall waive the
- 46 engine compartment component of the commercial driver's license test,
- 47 as set forth in 49 CFR 383.113(a)(1)(i), as amended from time to time, for
- 48 applicants seeking or renewing a public passenger endorsement to
- 49 operate a school bus as permitted by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety

50 Administration and published in the Federal Register of October 27, 51

- 2022. Any applicant who receives such a waiver and is granted a public
- 52 passenger endorsement to operate a school bus pursuant to subsection
- 53 (a) of section 14-44 of the general statutes shall only operate a school bus
- 54 within the state to transport students from home to school, from school
- 55 to home, or to and from school-sponsored events.

- 56 Sec. 4. (Effective from passage) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles 57 shall study and make recommendations regarding policies or initiatives 58 to respond to the nation-wide shortage of school bus drivers. Such study 59 shall consider, at a minimum, increasing the period of validity for a 60 commercial driver's license from a four-year period to a five-year period 61 and streamlining the licensing and renewal processes for a public 62 passenger endorsement to operate a school bus. On or before February 63 1, 2024, the commissioner shall submit the results of such study and 64 recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General 65 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to transportation, in 66 accordance with section 11-4a of the general statutes.
- 67 Sec. 5. Subsection (b) of section 14-275 of the general statutes is 68 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective July 1, 69 2023):
  - (b) Each school bus shall be painted a uniform yellow color known as "National School Bus Glossy Yellow", except for the fenders and trim which may be painted black and the roof which may be painted white, and shall have conspicuously painted on the rear and on the front of such vehicle, in black lettering of a size to be determined by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, the words "School Bus-Stop on Signal", except that each school bus equipped with an eight-light warning system shall have the words "School Bus" painted on the rear and on the front of such vehicle in such lettering. The sides of such vehicles may be inscribed with the words "School Bus", the school name or such other legend or device as may be necessary for purposes of identification or safety. Each school bus, and any student transportation vehicle, as defined in section 14-212, regularly used by any town,

LCO No. 4692 3 of 4 regional school district, private school or entity contracting with such town, regional school district or private school to transport school children to and from school or school activities, shall have conspicuously painted on the rear and sides of such bus or student transportation vehicle, in black lettering of a size to be determined by the commissioner, the name of the school bus company, the school bus company's telephone number and the school bus number or the name of the owner or operator of such student transportation vehicle, the telephone number of such owner or operator and the fleet number of such student transportation vehicle. The sides and rear of such school bus may display decals, posters or stickers for the purpose of advertising employment opportunities for school bus drivers.

## Statement of Purpose:

To (1) permit the use of a mobile electronic device for navigation purposes on a school bus by a school bus driver, (2) waive the engine compartment portion of the commercial driver license's test for applicants seeking or renewing a public passenger endorsement to operate a school bus, (3) study policies and initiatives to address the nationwide school bus driver shortage, and (4) permit the advertising of employment opportunities for school bus drivers on school buses.
