The amendment strikes a section of the underlying bill that had created new firearms related offenses, thereby removing said sections potential cost for incarceration or probation and potential revenue gain from fines.

The amendment also prohibits the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (DESPP) from establishing or maintaining any database or system that is used to track or otherwise monitor firearm ownership by state residents, resulting in potential savings to DESPP as they will no longer face costs for maintaining such database/system. However, DESPP may instead face increased administrative costs in order to determine when to send expiration notices and renewal forms to firearms permit holders.
