The Committee on Finance, Revenue and Bonding reported through REP. HORN of the 64th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF STATE REVENUE COLLECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Commissioner of Revenue
2 Services shall study the Department of Revenue Services' collections
3 processes to identify legislative and programmatic changes that may be
4 made to improve efficiency and reduce administrative costs of such
5 collections. Not later than January 1, 2025, the commissioner shall
6 submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
7 general statutes, on the commissioner's findings and recommendations
8 to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
9 cognizance of matters relating to finance, revenue and bonding.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1	<i>from passage</i>	New section
