Substitute Senate Bill No. 309

The Committee on Human Services reported through SEN. LESSER of the 9th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR CERTAIN LEGALLY PRESENT NONCITIZENS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Commissioner of Social Services,
2 in consultation with the executive director of the Office of Health
3 Strategy, shall study the feasibility, costs and benefits of providing
4 medical assistance to certain legally present noncitizens who would
5 have qualified for a program providing such assistance before the
6 program was closed to new applicants in 2011, pursuant to section 17b-
7 257b of the general statutes. Not later than January 1, 2025, the
8 commissioner shall file a report, in accordance with the provisions of
9 section 11-4a of the general statutes, on the results of the study with the
10 joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance
11 of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies
12 and human services.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
