The Committee on Planning and Development reported through SEN. RAHMAN of the 4th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

## **AN ACT CONCERNING MUNICIPAL AGENCIES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 7-148*l* of the general statutes is repealed and the  
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2024*):

3 Any person aggrieved by any order of the board, commission,  
4 council, committee or other agency established or designated pursuant  
5 to sections 7-148i to 7-148n, inclusive, and subparagraph (B) of  
6 subdivision (9) of subsection (c) of section 7-148 may appeal to the State  
7 Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities. Any such appeal  
8 shall be filed [within] not later than thirty days [of] after the mailing of  
9 the written decision.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
