REASONS FOR BILL:

The bill requires the Commissioner of Revenue Services to conduct a study on the Department of Revenue Services' collections processes. The study aims to identify potential legislative and programmatic changes that could enhance efficiencies and reduce administrative costs related to tax collections. The Commissioner must complete the study and submit a report with findings and recommendations to the Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee by January 1, 2025. Overall, the bill is needed to identify opportunities for improvement of the current state revenue collections processes to streamline tax collections and reduce costs.
