"AN ACT CONCERNING FOOD SCRAP DIVERSION FROM THE SOLID WASTE STREAM AND THE REDEMPTION OF OUT-OF-STATE BEVERAGE CONTAINERS."

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 14-270 of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1,*
5 *2024*):

6 (d) (1) The owner or lessee of any vehicle may pay either a fee of thirty
7 dollars for each permit issued for such vehicle under this section or a fee
8 as described in subdivision (3) of this subsection for such vehicle,
9 payable to the Department of Transportation. (2) An additional
10 transmittal fee of twelve dollars shall be charged for each permit issued
11 under this section and transmitted via electronic means. (3) The
12 commissioner may issue an annual permit for any vehicle transporting
13 (A) a divisible load, (B) an overweight or oversized-overweight

14 indivisible load, or (C) an oversize indivisible load. The owner or lessee
 15 shall pay an annual fee of nine dollars per thousand pounds or fraction
 16 thereof for each such vehicle. A permit may be issued in any increment
 17 up to one year, provided the owner or lessee shall pay a fee of one
 18 hundred dollars for such vehicle or vehicle and trailer for each month
 19 or fraction thereof. (4) The annual permit fee for any vehicle
 20 transporting an oversize indivisible load shall not be less than six
 21 hundred fifty dollars. (5) The commissioner may issue permits for
 22 divisible loads in the aggregate not exceeding fifty-three feet in length.
 23 (6) An additional engineering analysis fee of two dollars per thousand
 24 pounds or fraction thereof over two hundred thousand pounds shall be
 25 charged for an oversize-overweight vehicle and trailer or a commercial
 26 vehicle combination and load that exceeds a permit weight of two
 27 hundred thousand pounds. (7) The commissioner may issue a permit
 28 for a divisible load to a four-axle vehicle that is owned or operated by
 29 any person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of collecting
 30 recyclable materials and that is engaged in transporting recyclable
 31 materials, provided such vehicle does not exceed a maximum gross
 32 vehicle weight of seventy-three thousand pounds."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
