OFA Fiscal Note

No Fiscal Impact

The amendment strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact resulting in the following impact.

Section 1 creates a working group to study the risk associated with energy drink consumption by children and the anticipated effects of a prohibition on the sale of energy drinks to children resulting in no fiscal impact because the working group has the expertise to meet the requirements of the amendment.

Section 2 and 3 require the Department of Consumer Protection to develop signage regarding the medical risk of energy drinks and the Department of Public Health to develop a one-page document explaining the medical risks of energy drink consumption resulting in no fiscal impact because the agencies have the expertise to meet these requirements.

The preceding Fiscal Impact statement is prepared for the benefit of the members of the General Assembly, solely for the purposes of information, summarization and explanation and does not represent the intent of the General Assembly or either chamber thereof for any purpose. In general, fiscal impacts are based upon a variety of informational sources, including the analyst's professional knowledge.
