The amendment strikes sections 2, 4, and 5 which eliminates the potential cost in the underlying bill to the Department of Consumer Protection, Office of the Attorney General, and the State Comptroller.

The amendment also strikes and replaces section 3 which adds affordability as a reason for which a state or municipal agency can waive the section's prohibitions resulting in a possible decrease to the potential cost outlined in section 3 of the underlying bill.
