

1415 with the provisions of chapter 54 of the general statutes, as necessary
1416 to implement a fiscal accountability data collection report that will
1417 include all sources, amounts and uses of all public and private funds
1418 by school districts and by public schools, including public charter
1419 schools. The department shall report, not later than December 31, 2014,
1420 and annually thereafter, all such data as well as school size, student
1421 demographics, geography, cost-of-living indicators, and other factors
1422 determined by the department to the joint standing committee of the
1423 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
1424 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies and education in
1425 accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes.

1426 Sec. 42. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a
1427 Results First Policy Oversight Committee. The committee shall advise
1428 on the development and implementation of the Pew-MacArthur
1429 Results First cost-benefit analysis model, with the overall goal of
1430 promoting cost effective policies and programming by the state.

1431 (b) The committee shall consist of the following members:

1432 (1) Four members of the General Assembly, one of whom shall be
1433 appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, one of
1434 whom shall be appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate,
1435 one of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the House of
1436 Representatives, and one of who shall be appointed by the minority
1437 leader of the Senate;

1438 (2) The Chief Court Administrator, or the Chief Court
1439 Administrator's designee;

1440 (3) The Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee;

1441 (4) The director of the Office of Fiscal Analysis;

1442 (5) The director of the Office of Program Review and Investigations;

1443 (6) The director of the Office of Legislative Research;

1444 (7) The director of the Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy at
1445 Central Connecticut State University;

1446 (8) The executive director of the Commission on Children;

1447 (9) A representative of private higher education, appointed by the
1448 Connecticut Conference of Independent Colleges;

1449 (10) Two representatives of the Connecticut business community,
1450 one of whom shall be appointed by the majority leader of the House of
1451 Representatives, and one who shall be appointed by the majority
1452 leader of the Senate; and

1453 (11) Such other members as the committee may prescribe.

1454 (c) All appointments to the committee under subdivisions (1) to (11),
1455 inclusive, of subsection (b) of this section shall be made not later than
1456 thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall be
1457 filled by the appointing authority.

1458 (d) A member of the General Assembly selected jointly by the
1459 speaker of the House of Representatives and the president pro tempore
1460 of the Senate shall be the chairperson of the committee. Such
1461 chairperson shall schedule the first meeting of the committee, which
1462 shall be held not later than sixty days after the effective date of this
1463 section.

1464 (e) Members of the committee shall serve without compensation,
1465 except for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
1466 duties.

1467 (f) Not later than October 1, 2013, and annually thereafter, the
1468 committee shall submit a report to the Governor and the joint standing
1469 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
1470 relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies, in
1471 accordance with section 11-4a of the general statutes, recommending
1472 measures to implement the Pew-MacArthur Results First cost-benefit

1473 **analysis model.**

1474 Section 112 of house bill 6704 of the current session is amended to
1475 read as follows (*Effective from passage*):

1476 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4-28e of the general
1477 statutes, up to \$13,000,000 received by the state pursuant to the
1478 settlement of litigation resulting from the 1998 tobacco Master
1479 Settlement Agreement shall be deposited into a nonlapsing [fund]
1480 account to fund activity by the Office of the Attorney General and the
1481 Department of Revenue Services related to enforcement of such
1482 agreement. Funds from the account shall be made available in such
1483 amounts and at such times as determined by the Secretary of the Office
1484 of Policy and Management.

1485 Sec. 44. Subsection (a) of section 1-301 of the general statutes is
1486 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
1487 *1, 2013*):

1488 (a) (1) There shall be a Governmental Accountability Commission,
1489 within the Office of Governmental Accountability established under
1490 section 1-300, that shall consist of nine members as follows: (A) The
1491 chairperson of the Citizen's Ethics Advisory Board established under
1492 section 1-80, or the chairperson's designee; (B) the chairperson of the
1493 State Elections Enforcement Commission established under section 9-
1494 7a, or the chairperson's designee; (C) the chairperson of the Freedom of
1495 Information Commission established under section 1-205, or the
1496 chairperson's designee; (D) the executive director of the Judicial
1497 Review Council established under section 51-51k, or the executive
1498 director's designee; (E) the chairperson of the Judicial Selection
1499 Commission established under section 51-44a, or the chairperson's
1500 designee; (F) the chairperson of the Board of Firearms Permit
1501 Examiners established under section 29-32b, or the chairperson's
1502 designee; (G) the Child Advocate appointed under section 46a-13k, or
1503 the advocate's designee; (H) the Victim Advocate appointed under
