ANTHONY E. WALLACE, Republican, of Simsbury, Connecticut, was born in Stamford, Connecticut, December 6, 1915; was educated in New Haven public schools, Los Angeles Junior College, University of California at Los Angeles, and Harvard Business School; married Helen Barton, October 19, 1941; two children, Richard, a student at the University of Connecticut and Anthony, Jr., a sophomore at Simsbury High; since 1952 Director of Public Information, Connecticut Light and Power Company; Assistant Director of Research and Planning, Connecticut Development Commission 1943-52; member of faculty, Hillyer College (University of Hartford) 1946-52; member of American Institute of Planners, American Marketing Association, Regional Plan Association, Farmington River Watershed Association, Public Utilities Advertising Association, Hartford County Republican Associates, Connecticut Editorial Association; Past President, Harvard Business School Club of Hartford and past-chairman, Electric Utility Industry's Public Information Program Workshop; first elected to the House of Representatives in 1956 and has served continuously from the town of Simsbury where he is a member of the Republican Town Committee and a Director of Village Water Company; in 1959 Session served as Assistant Minority Leader; member of State Republican Policy and Platform Committee in 1958 and 1960.
